

# It's easy to travel to Malmö



**Malmö is easy to reach from the rest of Europe, regardless of whether you choose to go by plane, train, ferry or car. The excellent infrastructure in the Öresund region makes travelling between Sweden, Denmark and the Continent fast and smooth.**

## BY PLANE

Malmö is situated between two international airports, Copenhagen Airport in Denmark and Malmö-Sturup Airport 30 km south-east of Malmö. Malmö-Sturup Airport has several daily flight connections to Stockholm Arlanda with SAS, and to Bromma Airport with Malmö Aviation. Ryan Air operates a regular international flight service to Sturup from London/Stansted. The airport shuttle takes you from the centre of Malmö to Sturup Airport in 40 minutes.

Copenhagen Airport is connected to Malmö by the Öresund Bridge. Trains run around the clock from Malmö Central Station to the airport, and the journey from Malmö takes 20 minutes. Of course, the airport can also be reached by car. It's also possible to go by bus from Kastrup to Malmö Syd/Svägetorp, takes 10 minutes.

## BY CAR

July 2000 saw the opening of the Öresund Bridge, the 16 km long road link between Copenhagen and Malmö. Thanks to an extensive network of roads in the Öresund region, you can reach other parts of Sweden and Europe with ease.

From Malmö, you can take the E6 to Göteborg (Gothenburg) and Oslo. The E22 continues on to Kalmar or via Trelleborg to Rostock in Germany. The E65 connects Malmö to Poland via Ystad, then across the Baltic Sea to Swinoujscie. The E20 connects Malmö to Copenhagen and other parts of Denmark via the Öresund Bridge. ## BY TRAIN

SJ is the name of the Swedish State Railway Company, which runs most of the train services in Sweden. Malmö has international train connections with Copenhagen, Oslo and Berlin. You can travel from Malmö to Stockholm in 4 hours on the high-speed X2000 train.

Öresund trains depart Malmö for Copenhagen across the Öresund Bridge every 20 minutes from 6 a.m. to 12 midnight, and then once an hour during the night. The journey time from Malmö Central Station to Copenhagen Central Station is 35 minutes. The train also stops at Copenhagen Airport. The train journey from Malmö Central Station to Copenhagen Airport takes only 20 minutes.

## BY FERRY

TT-line operates on the Travemünde-Trelleborg and Rostock-Trelleborg routes. Scandlines operates on the Rostock-Trelleborg and Sassnitz-Trelleborg routes. Trelleborg is situated 30 km south of Malmö, a 30-minute drive away.

If you travel from Germany through Denmark to Malmö, you can either go with the Scandlines carrier from Travemünde to Gedser or from Puttgarden to Rødby, and then continue your journey across the Öresund Bridge to Malmö.
